Subject: Orders

On April 11, 2005, you were served with a Domestic Violence Protective Order (DVPO), Alaska Court System case number 3PA-05-210 CI.

This memorandum will serve as *written orders to you* as an Alaska State Trooper concerning your conduct pending resolution of this matter.

1. You will adhere to *all* provisions of the DVPO including, but not limited to the following:
 - You will not threaten to commit or commit acts of domestic violence, stalking or harassment.
 - You will not be in the physical presence of, telephone, contact or otherwise *communicate directly or indirectly* with the petitioner, except through her attorney concerning the pending divorce case.
 - You will stay away from any residence of the petitioner
 - You will stay away from and not telephone or contact the following additional locations:
 - Petitioners place of employment
 - Teeland Middle School
 - TLC Pre-School
 - Palin's house, Heath's house
 - You will not enter or follow a vehicle in the possession of or occupied by petitioner
 - Petitioner will have possession of and use of the 1992 Toyota Camry and 2001 Ford Expedition
 - You will pay \$1,000 per month beginning on May 1, 2005 for the support of the petitioner
2. You are also directed to review the Department of Public Safety's Operating Procedures Manual (OPM) chapter 212.110 paying specific attention to section E, sub-paragraphs 2 and 3.
3. In accordance with the provisions of OPM 212.110 (E) 2-3, you are directed to surrender all of your departmental firearms, ammunition, badges, credentials, and vehicle except when you are actually on duty. You will coordinate this process with your immediate supervisor, Sergeant Waldron, or if he is not available, with Lieutenant Papasodora. You will also disregard any and all SERT pages or call outs that you receive or that come to your attention.
4. The importance of your compliance with these written instructions cannot be over emphasized. It is understood that this is a particularly trying and stressful situation, however it is critical that you do not do anything which would or could be construed as a violation of these written orders.
5. It is also your responsibility to ensure that you comply with all conditions or limitations placed upon you, as a result of this protective order having been issued and served upon you.

This memorandum is not to be considered disciplinary in nature. It does, rather, provide written instructions to you regarding your conduct pending the resolution of this matter.

The conditions outlined above are effective immediately and will remain in effect until at least April 27, 2005; the date set in the judge's order for the next hearing in this matter. If you become aware of *any changes in the order's provisions or hearing date, you are to immediately notify Sergeant Waldron.*
